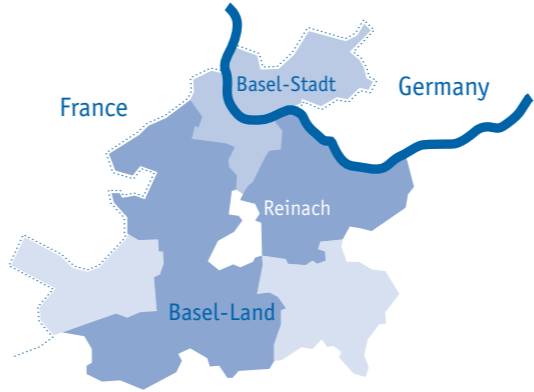


WELCOME TO REINACH



## REINACH – A CHARMING VILLAGE NEAR BASEL



Reinach is an evolving community, the size of a small city and yet as tranquil and pleasantly arranged as a country village. Reinach embodies the perfect balance between town and country: a mature community in close proximity to the city but out in the countryside. Reinach has a great deal of social, cultural and economic independence as seen in the highly stylised glass civic centre, designed by the renowned architects Morger & Degelo (Basel Trade Fair Tower, Art Museum Lichtenstein).

Reinach covers an area of 700 hectares. The River Birs flows through it. Reinach's highest point is 371 m above sea level and the lowest 274 m above sea level. The community has almost 19,000 inhabitants and is thus the most populous in Canton Basel-Land. Various motorway accesses and a well-developed public transport network make the journey into the city centre, but also to the main railway station (Bahnhof SBB) and the EuroAirport Basel-Mulhouse, a short one.

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## QUALITY IS NOT A QUESTION OF SIZE



**This mixture really works.** Both the established inhabitants of Reinach and the many newcomers appreciate its excellent location in the Basel area, the peaceful residential areas, the green surroundings including an important nature conservation area, the Reinacher Heide, the attractive recreational activities and shopping facilities and last but not least, the healthy economic environment. Living peacefully in a friendly area and close to the countryside, as well as the short commuter distances guarantee a good quality of life and standard of living.

**Lively community.** Reinach is cosmopolitan, with an enriching, multi-cultural diversity. One reason for this is the English-speaking International School Basel (ISB): children and teenagers from all over the world attend this school at its two locations – Reinach and Aesch. And generally, the well-rounded choice of schools available, from kindergarten through to secondary education level 1, makes the community very popular for families with children. The choice also includes a commercial secondary school and a music school.

**Attractive business location.** Internationally renowned trans-national corporations and global players, such as Endress & Hauser, Neoperl and Habasit, have their head offices in Reinach. Other big corporations operating in Reinach are chemical companies such as Roche and Clariant, as well as international high technology companies such as Siemens. Just as important for the economic prosperity of the community are, of course, the many small and medium-sized companies from various branches of trade and industry, through to the new start-ups in the business park that all make an important contribution to Reinach's rising economic value added.

**Moderate taxes.** Tax authority in Switzerland is divided between the central government, the cantons and the local council. The main part of the taxes are direct, which, for companies (legal persons), are levied on profit and capital and for private persons, on income and assets. Federal taxes are uniformly regulated for the whole of Switzerland. Cantonal and communal tax rates, on the other hand, vary according to place of residence or a company's legal domicile. In comparison to the national average, the tax rates in Basel-Land are very moderate. The same is true of Reinach in comparison to other communities.

## ON A THIRST FOR EDUCATION AND KNOWLEDGE

**Kindergarten.** Children living in Reinach who have their 4th birthday before the 1st May of any given year can attend their local kindergarten from the August of that year onwards. A place in the kindergarten is available to all children for two years, but it is only obligatory to attend for one year. The costs are met by the local council. In addition the council also runs a remedial teaching kindergarten and offers logopedial support as well as support teaching in German.

**Primary schools.** After kindergarten the children move on to the local, publicly-funded primary school, which they usually attend for five years. After the primary school follow secondary schools, which are arranged on three levels of achievement required and which take four years to complete.

**Secondary schools.** Reinach is the location of one of the best equipped commercial secondary schools. Attendance at a technical grammar school (offering limited access to university) or a grammar school is possible in the neighbouring communities of Munchenstein and Oberwil. The technical colleges are also within easy reach of Reinach.

**Higher education.** Those living in Reinach profit from its proximity to the city of Basel and the excellent infrastructure the university there offers. The College of Higher Education of North West Switzerland (FHNW) also offers a wide range of studies in the region.

**Music school.** The music school run by Reinach offers a wide range of high quality musical tuition. Children between five and seven years of age can attend the kindergarten choir. After completing the basic course, which is integrated in the syllabus of the primary school, the children can begin with tuition in playing an instrument. Ensembles and an orchestra complement the individual lessons, for which the parents have to pay a moderate contribution.

**Private schools.** Thanks to the International School Basel (ISB), Reinach has an English-speaking private school which covers the whole spectrum from kindergarten through to the international baccalaureate. The teachers and the school administrators are native English speakers and teach around 1,000 students from all over the world. The "Learn in"-Learning Centre in Reinach is a private educational institution, which offers individual or group tuition in a broad range of subjects.

**Beginning of the school year and school holidays.** The school year always begins in August and there are approximately 13 weeks of school holidays, spread over the entire year. **Childcare.** Working parents profit from the well-developed network of childcare on offer. The 'Verein für familienergänzende Tagesbetreuung' (association for family-supportive day-care) offers both subsidized places in day-care centres and day-care with families. In the KITA of the primary schools Aumatten and Reinacherhof, kindergarten and primary school children are looked after and helped over lunchtime, on school-free afternoons and after school. There are also two private day-care centres on offer.

## REINACH'S CULTURAL LIFE



**Reinach as a cultural centre.** The inhabitants of Reinach enjoy a widely varied range of cultural activities within comfortable reach, thanks to the town's proximity to Basel. Many exhibitions, concerts, plays and lectures are also held in Reinach itself. Information about local events can be found in the Reinach Council Calendar which is published every half-year and distributed free to all households, but also on the Council website [www.reinach-bl.ch](http://www.reinach-bl.ch) as well as in the daily newspapers.

**Lively clubs and societies.** There are currently more than 100 very diverse clubs and societies in Reinach. The societies of Reinach organised themselves into a community of interests some years ago (IGOR). The main function of IGOR is to coordinate between the societies themselves and with the authorities. A complete list of all the member societies of IGOR can be found on the Council website [www.reinach-bl.ch](http://www.reinach-bl.ch) or collected from the Town Office, Hauptstrasse 10.

**Markets for all your needs.** Some of the town's great attractions are the Reinach markets, popular not just with the local inhabitants. They include the traditional monthly market, the weekly vegetable market and the festive Reinach Christmas market. The children's flea market



is definitely also worth a visit: It is held twice a year (early summer/autumn) in front of the local history museum. The exact dates of the Reinach markets can be found in the Reinach Council Calendar or on the Council website.

**The Local History Museum.** Lovers of museums will find what they are looking for in Reinach's museum of local history. Part of the museum is a coach house with a collection of old agricultural equipment. In an outhouse there are a bakery, a smithy, a basket-weaver's and a saddler's workshop. In the museum garden is an Early Medieval pit-house. Further information is available under [www.heimatmuseumreinach.ch](http://www.heimatmuseumreinach.ch).

## TRANQUIL AND RELAXING

**Recreational facilities.** There are many indoor and outdoor facilities available in Reinach for all sorts of sporting activities. The playgrounds and gym halls attached to the schools all over the municipal area are very popular, as is the football field at the sports field 'Einschlag' on the General-Guisan Strasse. The vita parcours (jogging paths) in Moosholz are frequented a great deal, so are the tennis courts on the Heideweg, the open-air swimming pool on the Mühlemattweg and, for cycling fanatics the BMX track on the Rainenweg. Children love the various attractive local playgrounds. Those who like barbecues will find plenty of attractive, family-friendly barbeque areas with fireplaces on the Bruderholz or the Reinacher Heide, all there for the general public. The individual facilities are marked in the official local map. The addresses of the various sports clubs can be found in the list of clubs and societies of the Community of Interests of Reinach's local associations (IGOR) or on [www.reinach-bl.ch](http://www.reinach-bl.ch) (reference 'Vereine').

**Local recreation areas.** One great plus that Reinach has to offer are its attractive and valuable green surroundings. Especially noteworthy is the Reinacher Heide (Reinach heath), the largest intact natural landscape in Reinach's municipal area. It is a dry landscape of national significance. Hedgerows alternate with dry grassland and provide a habitat for many rare and endangered species of plants and animals. The Reinach heath is a nature conservation area and a popular destination for ramblers from miles around. The Leywald (woods) on the western border of the borough also offers space in which to recuperate. Those who go for a walk through it can follow the charmingly laid out Waldlehrpfad (forest trail), which starts next to the buildings of the Fiechten school, or the Skulpturenweg (sculpture trail) with its beautiful wooden statues depicting figures from the world of fairy tales. In the Tierpark (animal park) in two large enclosures are to be found various types of deer, cranes, peacocks, ducks, geese and pheasants. Reinach is part of the Birseck Network of Paths with numerous footpaths and cycling paths. The cycling network has been expanded continuously and connected up with the cantonal cycling network. At particularly beautiful points there are benches and picnic areas. The view out over the Birseck is especially impressive from along the Hollenweg.



## ON DUTY TOGETHER

**Einwohnerrat.** The “Einwohnerrat” is the legislative authority of the borough. Its 40 members are elected once every four years. Some of its most important duties are issuing regulations, setting tax rates and sanctioning the budget and the end-of-year financial statement, as well as supervising the administration. The meeting place of the “Einwohnerrat” is the large hall in the Town Hall. The “Einwohnerrat” meets on the last Monday of the month for its regular meetings. They are open to the general public.

**Gemeinderat.** The “Gemeinderat” is the executive authority of the borough. It consists of seven members, each of whom is responsible for one of the following areas of responsibility: presidency, education/culture/recreation, finance and economics, health and social services, structural engineering, civil engineering as well as public areas and environment. These local councillors, who perform their duties on a part-time basis, are elected by the population for a term of four years. The presidency of the “Gemeinderat” is also determined by public vote. As a general rule the “Gemeinderat” holds one meeting per week which is not open to the public.

### Other authorities and political bodies.

Many citizens of Reinach volunteer for part time work in other political bodies that are part of the council (school council, social welfare authorities, guardianship office etc). They find support for these important communal tasks among the political parties and groups. ### Bürgergemeinde.

The “Bürgergemeinde” in Reinach plays an important traditional role. Their main duties include bestowing the citizenship of Reinach, cultivating the woods, donation of their property for public purposes or for purposes in the public interest, as well as the advancement of social and cultural establishments.

### Parishes.

Both the Roman Catholic and the Evangelical Reformed churches offer a wide range of activities for people of all ages and origin. They deal with current topics and take care of the community, traditions and ecumenical issues. ## WELL-ORGANISED AND CLEAN

**Efficient public services.** For Reinach, just as for the rest of the region, the standard of medical health care is first class. The postal and banking services are also of exceptional quality. In Reinach there are local branches of all the main Swiss Banks. The postal services have two offices – in Herrenweg and the Surbaum area. The security services, power supplies and communication are all very well organised. The high-power glass fibre network of the regional council aerial (GGA) is available for television reception and internet connection. The water supply delivers highest quality drinking water and is provided by the local waterworks (WWR). Used waste water is purified in the waste water purification plant in Birsfelden.

**Regular waste disposal.** Domestic rubbish and other refuse are collected regularly, throughout the whole borough. The costs are covered by household fees, which are collected in the form of stickers (‘Abfallmarken’), which have to be stuck on the rubbish bags. Information on collection days, collection points and fees is listed in the Abfallfibel (refuse manual), sent to all households every year. ## ENGLISH COMMUNITY

**Quickly integrated.** Reinach, with its central yet peaceful location and good infrastructure, is the ideal location for a long-term stay – whether to work or to live. These are some of the reasons why more and more English-speaking families are settling here. They are warmly welcomed in Reinach and quickly make contact with a lively network of English language services and activities. In the milieu of the International School there are a variety of contact groups for children and their parents.

**Well advised.** Companies wishing to expand their activities in Reinach will find easy and uncomplicated access to advice on administrative requirements as well as existing support and development programs in the Town Office.

**Easy and informative.** In the internet there are a number of websites which offer detailed, up-to-date information about the region around Basel, in English. Worthy of mention are the websites of Basel’s City Marketing ([www.basel.ch](http://www.basel.ch)) or Basel Tourism ([www.basel.com](http://www.basel.com)).

The English Corner of the newspaper the ‘Basler Zeitung’ ([www.baz.ch](http://www.baz.ch)) offers an overview of the regional English-speaking groups and organisations as well as a great deal of other useful information about daily life in Basel’s tri-border region. The organisation Centrepoint ([www.centrepoint.ch](http://www.centrepoint.ch)), where people can meet, borrow books, attend language discussion groups and take advantage of a wide choice of services and programmes is a central hub for the English-speaking inhabitants of the region.



## LIVING IN REINACH

**Housing for all tastes.** Whether in a private house or an apartment – Reinach offers homes that fit every requirement. On the Rebberg you will find larger homes whilst the valley offers family homes alternating with apartment blocks, some owner-occupied, others rented. The many gardens and green spaces create a relaxed residential atmosphere. Apartments to rent can be found in the appropriate property markets, in all sizes and standards. **Registration made easy.** Anyone wishing to take up residence in Reinach and who holds a foreign resident's I.D. can register in the Local Council's Town Office. Registration costs CHF 20 and has to be completed within fourteen days of moving here. You have to appear at the counter personally and bring the following documents with you:

- Passport from your country of origin
- The Swiss foreign resident's I.D. which confirms your residence status
- A confirmation from your employer or a work permit from the KIGA in Pratteln
- Medical insurance certificates for all members of the family
- The rental contract or deeds of or purchase for a residence in Reinach
- For families: marriage certificate plus the birth certificates of the children
- Two photos of all members of the family

Anyone wishing to move to Switzerland from abroad first has to apply for a foreign resident's I.D. The application is also prepared by the Town Office and forwarded by them to the relevant office. The office responsible for issuing foreign residents I.D.s is the:

## AT YOUR SERVICE

### **The Town Office provides information.**

The council administration has organised the Town Office as the central contact point for all administrative queries related to the community. It is situated on the ground floor of the civic centre and is open to all members of the population requiring information. The Town Office is also in charge of the council's Einwohnerkontrolle (Register of Inhabitants) and the AHV-/disability insurance branch office. Forms, certificates, fee stamps and numerous brochures and information sheets about what is on offer in the community and the region, can all be obtained at the Town Office. The members of staff at the Town Office can provide information about who to contact in the case of more specific questions. They are happy to assist non-German speakers in English.

There are free advisory services for many questions and problems, particularly for social issues, in Reinach itself or in the region. However, since these services are usually not available in English it is advisable to take a German-speaking confidant along with you. Confidential information about the relevant services can also be obtained from the Town Office.
